# **A** CAUTION

Read this document before installing the snowplow.

# **A** CAUTION

See your FISHER® outlet for application recommendations. The Kit Selection Guide has specific vehicle and snowplow requirements.

#### SAFETY INFORMATION

# **WARNING**

Indicates a potentially hazardous situation that, if not avoided, could result in death or serious personal injury.

#### **A** CAUTION

Indicates a situation that, if not avoided, could result in damage to product or property.

NOTE: Identifies tips, helpful hints, and maintenance information the owner/operator should know.

#### **SAFETY PRECAUTIONS**

Improper installation and operation could cause personal injury, and/or equipment and property damage. Read and understand labels and the *Owner's Manual* before installing, operating, or making adjustments.

# **A** WARNING

Lower blade when vehicle is parked. Temperature changes could change hydraulic pressure, causing the blade to drop unexpectedly or damaging hydraulic components. Failure to do this can result in serious personal injury.

# **A WARNING**

Remove blade assembly before placing vehicle on hoist.

# **A** WARNING

The driver shall keep bystanders clear of the blade when it is being raised, lowered or angled. Do not stand between the vehicle and the blade or within 8 feet of a moving blade. A moving or falling blade could cause personal injury.

#### **A WARNING**

Keep hands and feet clear of the blade and A-frame when mounting or removing the snowplow. Moving or falling assemblies could cause personal injury.

#### **A WARNING**

Do not exceed GVWR or GAWR including blade and ballast. The rating label is found on driver-side vehicle door cornerpost.

### **A** CAUTION

Refer to the Kit Selection Guide for minimum vehicle recommendations and ballast requirements.

#### **A** CAUTION

To prevent accidental movement of the blade, always turn the ON/OFF switch to OFF whenever the snowplow is not in use. The control indicator light will turn off.

# PERSONAL SAFETY

- Wear only snug-fitting clothing while working on your vehicle or snowplow.
- Do not wear jewelry or a necktie, and secure long hair.
- Wear safety goggles to protect your eyes from battery acid, gasoline, dirt and dust.
- Avoid touching hot surfaces such as the engine, radiator, hoses and exhaust pipes.
- Always have a fire extinguisher rated BC handy, for flammable liquids and electrical fires.

## FIRE AND EXPLOSION

# **A WARNING**

Gasoline is highly flammable and gasoline vapor is explosive. Never smoke while working on a vehicle. Keep all open flames away from gasoline tanks and lines. Wipe up any spilled gasoline immediately.

Be careful when using gasoline. Do not use gasoline to clean parts. Store only in approved containers away from sources of heat or flame.

# **VENTILATION**

# **A** WARNING

Vehicle exhaust contains deadly carbon monoxide (CO) gas. Breathing this gas, even in low concentrations, could cause death. Never operate a vehicle in an enclosed area without venting exhaust to the outside.

# **TORQUE CHART**


# **A** CAUTION

Read instructions before assembling. Fasteners should be finger tight until instructed to tighten according to the torque chart. Use standard methods and practices when attaching snowplow including proper personal protective safety equipment.

#### INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS


- 1. Remove the front bumper.
- Remove the four fasteners on each side from the BlockerBeam™ support brackets and remove the beam. Affix tag 66871 using the cable tie provided. Beam must be transferred when vehicle is sold or traded.



### **A WARNING**

Removing the BlockerBeam™ without installing snowplow attachment hardware may affect air bag deployment in a crash. Do not operate the truck unless either the BlockerBeam or the snowplow attachment hardware is installed on the vehicle.

 Place template on BlockerBeam bracket. Push vertical surface of template tight to vertical leg of bracket. Insert two 1/2" fasteners through template slots and BlockerBeam bracket holes. Align template as shown below.




4. Use template to mark and drill a 5/8" hole through each vertical leg of both BlockerBeam brackets. (See Photo 1.)

- 5. Starting with the driver-side pushplate, position the rear section in place by fitting the pushplate between the leaf springs and the frame. On some vehicles it will be necessary to jack up the frame slightly to gain more clearance between the frame and the springs. Check for and eliminate any interference with Ford nut retainers on bottom of frame.
- 6. Once the rear section is in place, rotate the front section of the pushplate into place and loosely attach front of pushplate to BlockerBeam brackets using four 1/2-13x1-3/4 cap screws, flat washers, and locknuts and four 1/2"x1-1/2" cap screws, flat washers, and locknuts through the cross-drilled holes in the BlockerBeam bracket. (See diagram below.)



For all vehicles with swaybar bracket: Loosely attach rear of pushplate to swaybar bracket using 1/2" x 1-1/2" cap screws, one flat washer on top of swaybar bracket and one on bottom of pushplate slotted hole, and locknuts.

For all vehicles without swaybar bracket: Proceed to step 8.


- 8. Repeat step 2-6 on passenger side.
- 9. Loosely attach cross bar between both pushplates using four 1/2" x 1-1/2" cap screws and locknuts.
- 10. Attach rear of pushplate.

For all vehicles with swaybar bracket: With the rear of the pushplate seated against both the side and bottom of the frame, mark and drill two 9/16" holes through the side of the frame using pushplate holes as guides. Fasten using two 1/2" x 1-1/2" cap screws with handles, washers and locknuts.

For all vehicles without swaybar bracket: With the rear of each pushplate seated against both the side and the bottom of the frame, mark and drill two 9/16" holes through bottom of frame using pushplate holes as guides. To facilitate drilling, remove pushplates and drill smaller pilot holes to start. Place a bushing between the pushplate and frame, centered over the rear hole. Fasten loosely using two 1/2" x 1-1/2" cap screws with handles, washers and locknuts.

Mark and drill two 9/16" holes through the side of the frame using pushplate holes as guides. Fasten loosely using two 1/2" x 1-1/2" cap screws with handles, washers and locknuts.

11. Measure the center-to-center distance at the front and rear of the connecting arms. It must be 29-1/8"±1/8". (See diagram below.) While mount is



- loose, adjust mount on the vehicle until this dimension is attained. Once the dimension is correct, tighten the four fasteners that attach the cross bar to the driver-side and passenger-side pushplates. Next, tighten the eight vertical blocker beam bracket fasteners, followed by the vertical swaybar bracket fasteners. Double check the center-to-center distance and, if correct, tighten all remaining fasteners.
- 12. Use the anti-chafing material and cable ties to tie up cooling lines on the driver side, forward of the front-most radiator. It is important to provide sufficient clearance between all portions of the cooling lines and the driver-side pushplate.
- 13. Reinstall front bumper.
- 14. Attach front of rubber air deflector that was originally attached to BlockerBeam to the bottom of the airdam with the four provided cable ties. (See Photo 3.)



NOTE: After five to ten hours of snowplow usage, retorque all attachment assembly fasteners.

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
